Overview:

Pfizer created the Diflucan® Partnership in 2000 to improve the quality of life for people living with HIV and AIDS. Pfizer and its partners distribute millions of Diflucan® (fluconazole) treatments for AIDS-related fungal infections free of charge to governmental and nongovernmental organizations in developing countries. Pfizer also provides materials to support patient education and healthcare worker training.

To provide treatment for AIDS-related fungal infections in developing countries.

Across the globe, only one in five people with HIV/AIDS receive the medicines they need. (UN Millennium Development Goals Report, 2006)

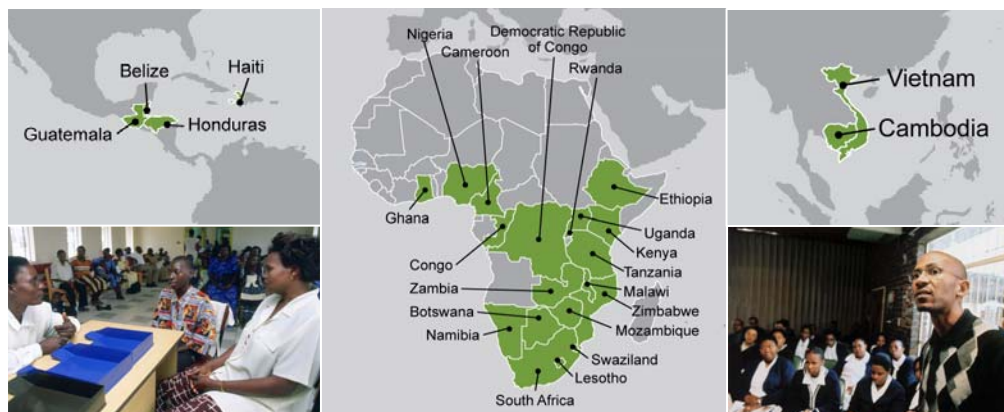
Partners:
